Professional mountain biker

Brice has been a professional mountain biker since 2012, and prior to his work as a contributing writer and photographer at Pinkbike.com as well as various other mountain bike publications, he started his own website in 2011 called Fattirefests.com. He had several videos and photos recognized as «video» or «photo of the day» on Pinkbike, and had well over 100 stories published online or in print since 2013.

In April of 2018, he delivered his first ever keynote speech to 86 high school students for a writing competition being held at Garnet Valley High School, and continue to be a part of career development days for junior and senior students.

Vallée Bras-du-Nord

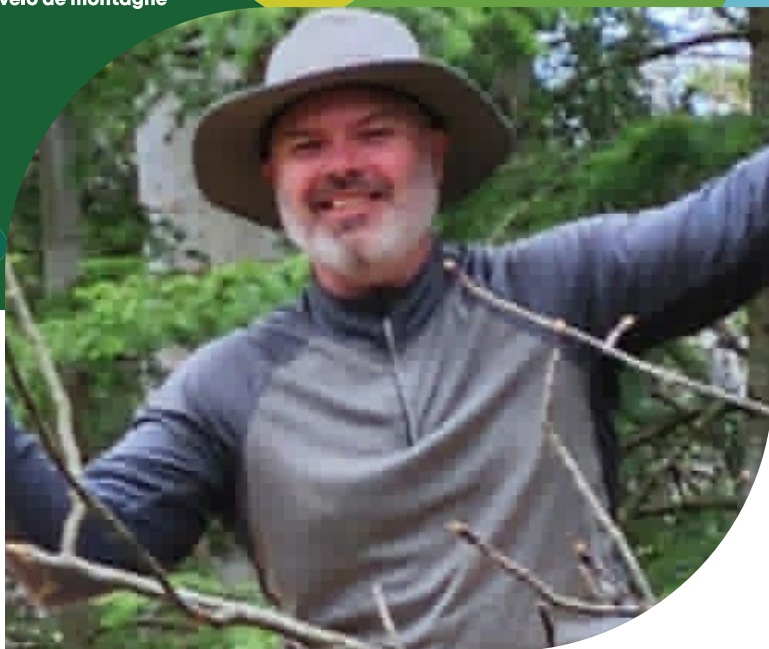
Etienne Beaumont, originally from Saint-Raymond-de-Portneuf, has been a key player in the development of the Vallée Bras-du-Nord Solidarity Cooperative since 2004, where he serves as Deputy Director.

He holds a bachelor's degree in outdoor intervention and a certificate in youth intervention from UQAC. He coordinates the En Marche project, a socio-professional integration program that has helped over 375 young people who were distant from the job market. He has also been involved in trail development in Vallée Bras-du-Nord since 2004.

In recognition of his commitment, he received the Reconnaissance jeunesse award in 2018 and the Sylvie Marois award in 2015 for his dedication to the outdoor sector.

He served as a municipal councillor for the City of Saint-Raymond for two terms from 2013 to 2021, notably overseeing files related to sustainable development and culture.

He is also Vice-Chair of the cooperative's Board of Directors.

Vélo Mag

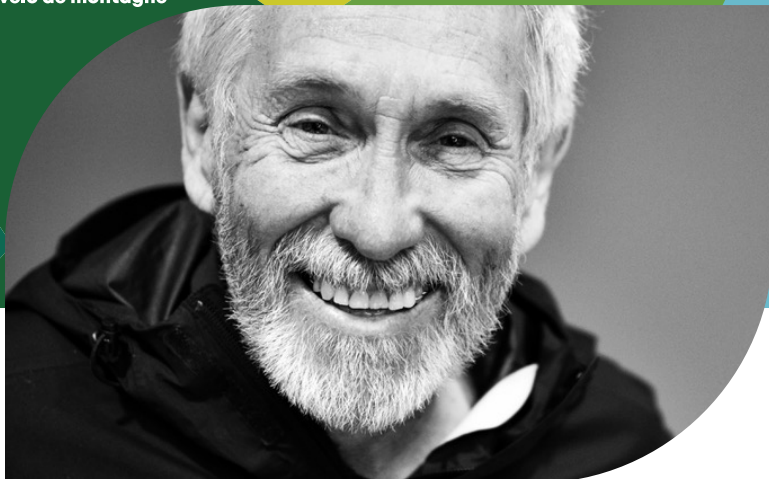

His expertise has shaped destinations around the globe, and creating more Olympics, World Championship, World Cup, Enduro World Series & Crankworx, than any person in the world. Inducted by "The Mountain Bike Hall of Fame", recognised internationally for his pioneering approach to innovative and sustainable trail design, Glen has dedicated his life to creating riding experiences that challenge and inspire, while ensuring environmental integrity and safety for all riders. His work spans continents, from rugged backcountry adventures, successful destinations and high level competitive tracks, through to multi-functional progression within the industry, whilst always pushing the boundaries of what is possible. Beyond trail building, Glen's creative background as a cartoonist, graphic designer, and filmmaker helped capture the early spirit of mountain biking, producing some of the world's first mountain bike movies.

Passionate about the future of mountain biking, Glen continues to mentor the next generation of riders and trail builders, ensuring that the trails he creates today will inspire adventure for years to come.

Northern Forest Center**

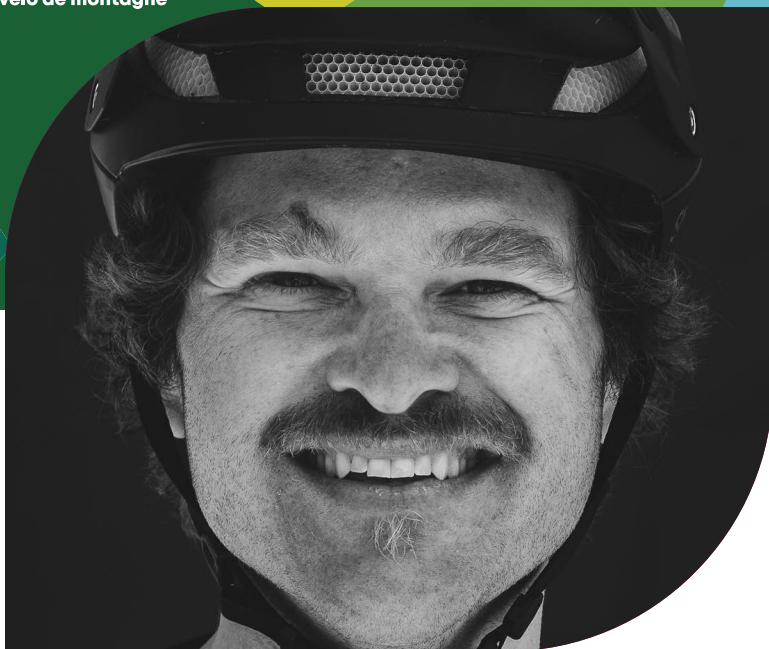

In 2017, Rachel made the switch to enduro, raced EWS and won Eastern States Cup Pro downhill and enduro overall titles on a trail bike. That's when the love for downhill sparked. Her experience on the world stage is paying off, including now 12 enduro World Series, 2 DH World Championships and 22 DH World Cups.
